FairTax passes Times Union Tests with Ease

WASHINGTON, DC - A week into their campaign for sweeping, bi-partisan comprehensive tax reform, Americans for Fair Taxation is pleased with the ever-increasing support from the press. Most recently, the Florida Times-Union (Jacksonville, Fl.) expressed mock surprise at the resurgence of tax reform as an issue in Congress, and jokingly attributed the newfound vitality to the wonder drug, Viagra (article attached).
